The goal of the PA Preferred ${ }^{T M}$ Baking Contest is to encourage young people across the Commonwealth to participate in Pennsylvania's agricultural fairs by showcasing Pennsylvania grown and produced products in their contest entries.

## RULES:

1. Participant must be an individual amateur baker (age 8 through 18) who is a Pennsylvania resident. One entry per person.
2. Entrants may NOT have won 1st place in this PA Preferred ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ Junior Baking Contest at any other fair in 2024.
3. Entry must be six (6) individual sized portions of the baked entry item.

4. Entire entry must be made from scratch. No pre-packaged ingredients may be used (ex. pre-made mixes, cookie dough, pie crust, frosting, etc) All ingredients and decorations must be edible.
*5. At least two (2) PA Preferred ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ locally produced ingredients must be used in the recipe. Some examples of qualifying ingredients are PA Preferred ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ grains such as oats or flour, butter, milk, eggs, fruits and/or vegetables.
6. A PA Preferred ${ }^{\top \mathrm{M}}$ logo is not required because not all PA Preferred ${ }^{\top \mathrm{M}}$ products carry the label. The name of the ingredient and the source is sufficient. Contact RA-AGPAPreferred@pa.gov for any assistance with qualifying ingredients.
7. Entry must be submitted for judging on a food safe disposable setting. (All pans, plates and dishes are considered disposable and will not be returned.)
*8. Recipe(s) must be submitted with the entry, printed on one side of $8-1 / 2$ " $\times 11$ " paper. Recipe must list all ingredients, quantities, and the preparation instructions. The PA Preferred ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ ingredients must be listed clearly in the ingredient list, specifying the ingredients and the company that made/grew them (ex. PA Preferred Milk Galliker's brand). Entrant's name, age, address and phone number must be printed on the back side of all the pages. (All recipes and cookies-brownies-bars will become the property of the Fair or PA Farm Show and will not be returned).
9. Refrigeration is not available at the fair or PA Farm Show. Entries that require refrigeration after baking must indicate so in the recipe. Those entries will not be sold auctioned or otherwise distributed for consumption after judging for food safety reasons. Judging Criteria

Portrait - captures the personality of the human subject, either as a head shot or full shot. Props may be included in portraits.
Still Life - focuses on mostly commonplace objects which may be either natural (food, flowers, plants, etc.) or man-made (drinking glasses, books, etc.) in a pleasing arrangement.
Action, Sports - Shows active movement in a sporting activity, focusing on a player(s) caught in action.
Carbon County Fair - photo taken at last year's fair.
Architecture - A shot that focuses on the unique architectural features of a building without a lot of background.

All artwork should have the necessary hardware, eyehooks, picture wire or hanger attached so the artwork may hang from a small metal hook (see illustration). Single centered hangers are discouraged. The hardware must be able to support the weight of the artwork over time. FoamCore or a very stiff cardboard backing should be used to prevent warping while hanging. Hot glue the string or wire ends to the back of the FoamCore. Artwork submitted without necessary hardware may not be judged or displayed
Please do not submit entries with wet or sticky surfaces. Pastel, chalk and charcoal works must be covered with acetate. Extremely fragile artwork should not be submitted.
Please note that artwork is greatly affected by changes in the weather and humidity. Masking tape and air-dried clays are especially susceptible to these conditions. Please consider submitting artwork using packing tapes and sculpture using kiln-fired clays.
